Neighbourhood Plan result

The Parish Council would like to thank the whole Neighbourhood Plan Team for their hard work in completing the Cholsey Neighbourhood Plan. There was a 32.7% turnout for the referendum on March 14th with 931 voting in favour and 43 against. A total of 96% in favour.

Animal Sanctuary

The Parish Council are aware of concerns regarding the animal sanctuary on the bypass. Trading Standards have inspected the site and given the animals a clean bill of health. SODC Planning Enforcement are investigating the potential planning breaches on the site.

Gravel Update

Mark Gray writes...

I still have no news on the so called "Marina" gravel pit. I understand the developers have asked for more time to put their case. I am pressing officers to make a recommendation. A County Council working group is suggesting that the north/south split in future gravel extraction should be 14/86, with the 86% coming to the south. This is aimed at redressing the historic bias to extraction in the north of the county. I shall be opposing this split.

Cholsey's Tomorrow

Global warming is currently happening at a rate of 0.16°C per decade. Because the warming effects of CO2 take decades to accumulate, we have not yet started to feel the impact of much of the carbon we've already emitted. This time lag makes it hard to appreciate how serious the problem already is. Methane, on the other hand, has a warming potential far greater than CO2, but stays in the atmosphere only 12 years. Climate change that is taking place because of increases in CO2 concentration is largely irreversible for 1000s of years after emissions stop. Stopping methane emissions, on the other hand, stops temperature rise very quickly. Methane gas comes from fracking and rotting vegetables -best to compost. When composting ensure that moisture, warmth with plenty of active aeration happens, this procedure reduces methane emissions.



Citizens Advice boosts help for Universal Credit claimants

Citizens Advice has designed a new service to help you and speed things up if you are claiming Universal Credit for the first time but having problems with the application.

The "Help to Claim" service will be available in England from 1 April 2019 over the telephone, face to face, and online through "webchat" and Internet content.

We can advise on your eligibility, set up an email address or Universal Credit account, fill in the initial application form, get access to a computer, or arrange advance payments. We can also help you by ensuring that the right evidence is submitted with your form. And if you only need minimal help with your application, Citizens Advice can provide tips if you get stuck.

As part of its normal service, Citizens Advice also supports people who are already receiving Universal Credit.
