1914-1918 Cholsey Remembers

Remembrance Sunday this year is an opportunity to mark the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War - especially as the 11th November falls on the Sunday itself in 2018. In addition to the usual service at the church and on the Forty at 3pm, a special Centenary Commemoration will be held on the Forty at 10:45am. This will include poignant acts of remembrance, not only for the 67 men connected with Cholsey who died but also those who survived and their families who suffered hardship and loss back on the Home Front. A major part of these commemorations will be an installation of knitted poppies, produced by a wide group of all ages across the village. Ably lead by Jean Salter and Jan Morgan, this group have knitted close to 1000 poppies, almost double their intended target, and the installation is sure to be evocative and sobering. The ceremony will also include contributions from Cholsey children, showing that the spirit of remembrance continues with current generations too.

Please do attend, all are welcome. Do arrive in time for a prompt start at 10:45 – and if you are unable to attend but happen to be passing around 11, please drive respectfully as we gather at the centre of the village.
