Developer 'Flying a Kite' for 600 houses

Cholsey Parish Council is horrified to learn that a developer, Leavesley, is asking SODC for permission to look into the possibility of building up to 400 houses plus an 80- bed Care Home. The development would be built on the large field between Fair Mile and the village. The Council opposes this proposal as it is completely contrary to our Neighbourhood Plan. All of the new housing provision within the Neighbourhood Plan has either been built or is at the planning stage.

Council is asking for the developers to undertake an Environmental Impact Assessment, with particular reference to the cumulative effects of all the large amount of development already committed around Wallingford and Cholsey are considered together.

We have also flagged up two Special Areas of Conservation which are within the local area likely to be affected and that SODC could not rule out significant harmful effects for the 200 homes proposed in the Neighbourhood Plan Other potential impacts are also identified in the Cholsey Neighbourhood Plan Site Assessment, including landscape, roads, health and education services. Although not part of the neighbourhood plan it is also likely that the proposed development will have significant impacts on the historic environment of Wallingford due to congestion at peak hours on the Wallingford bypass, Reading Road and in the town centre. It will be likely to exacerbate issues in the Wallingford Air Quality Management Area.

Oxfordshire residents that have been affected by suicide are urged to give their feedback to help shape a suicide prevention strategy

Between 2016 and 2018 there were a total of 155 deaths by suicide in Oxfordshire. Of these, 126 of these were men which means that deaths in men outnumbered those in women by 4:1. The Oxfordshire suicide prevention group is about to revise its action plan and develop a strategy and wants to hear from people in Oxfordshire who have been affected by suicide or who may have had suicidal thoughts themselves.

There is a determination to reduce the numbers of death by suicide therefore we are asking residents to complete the survey www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/suicidepreventionsurve y to help achieve this understanding.
