Remembrance Sunday

From Sunday 10th onwards Cholsey will be falling in with most of the rest of the Country by having our Remembrance Ceremony at 10.45am rather than the previous arrangement in the afternoon. The ceremony will involve readings, hymns/songs and the act of remembrance. This move follows last year's very successful act of remembrance which took place to mark the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War.



Planning Update

Bellway Homes have put in a planning application for the second phase of their East End Farm development. The application is for 106 houses and this is part of the Neighbourhood Plan allocation.

We are particularly pleased that Bellway are including eight bungalows within the scheme as there is a particular need within the village for housing for older people.

At the November Parish Council meeting we resolved to support this application with the

provisos that a zebra crossing is included on the Wallingford Road and that a permanent right of way is established through the site.

Skate Park

Plans for the skate park are continuing apace. We have met with a number of contractors and have now applied to the District Council for planning permission.

In the near future we will be applying to the SODC Capital grants fund and we are looking for other grants. If you would like to make a contribution to the fund please contact the Parish office.

OxCam Expressway Mark Gray writes.....

I am pleased to be able to report that the County Council has voted to oppose the Oxford Cambridge Expressway.

This ill-conceived road, which is a Trojan horse for untold development across its- still to be decided -route, was opposed by all but seven councillors.

The motion concludes: "Oxfordshire does not support the building of the Expressway irrespective of which route is chosen". This decision will not in itself see off the road as this is a Central Government project, but it does give them a steer on our feelings on this issue.

Workplace Parking Levy

The County Council is consulting on the introduction of a workplace parking charge; essentially companies within Oxford who have more than ten parking spaces for employees will be charged £600 per annum for each space. It is likely that this charge will be passed on to employees.

Income raised from this scheme will be used to improve infrastructure for bus users, pedestrians and cyclists within the city. The consultation is on the OCC website and I would encourage anyone who might be affected by this to respond.

New Staff

We would also like to give a warm welcome to Susie, who is taken the role of coordinator for COPA and Vicky who has been appointed to the role of Environment Coordinator.

Both of the above posts have been part funded by Mark Gray's councillor priority fund.

Our Car Park

Our troublesome car park at the Pavilion will be having a major overhaul towards the end of November.

A contractor will be diagnosing the issues with the existing surface and will then proceed to replace the surface and the below ground drainage substrate.

Repair café

Cholsey Repair Café operates regularly on the third Saturday of odd-numbered months, from 11.00 to 13.45 at the Pavilion. Our next event will be on Saturday 16th November. Our repair skills are wide-ranging and now include sharpening of tools and ultrasonic cleaning of small items. We PAT test all electrical equipment we repair. Citizens Advice celebrates 80 years as vital service continues

Volunteers and staff from CAB Oxfordshire South and Vale were joined by representatives from town and district councils at the Guildhall in Abingdon on 15 October to celebrate 80 years of service to our communities.

CAB was founded the day after World War II was declared, to help people deal with the impact. Volunteers gave advice on evacuation, ration books, new housing for those who had been bombed and even recipes using limited food. Eighty years on, the issues may have changed, but the core values of Citizens Advice remain the same: to provide free, confidential and impartial advice to everyone everywhere.

Last year, CAB South and Vale, an independent charity, helped 11,999 people resolve 20,200 problems including debt, housing, Universal Credit, benefits, family problems and consumer issues. For many people this service is a lifeline. The number of people seeking advice has increased hugely and the local offices need more volunteers to keep the service running.
